The following findings are based on respondents' reported impacts from 1 April to 30 June 2020.

Jobs in art galleries, libraries, museums and archive operations fell 35%.

This was based on expected versus actual number of employees reported by partnerships, companies and not-for-profits operating in the art gallery, library, museum and archive sector. There were significant decreases in casual jobs (down 76%) and freelance and contract jobs (down 62%).
